Seed Lists for Interval and Sprint

- Seed lists for the Interval Start competition and the Sprint Qualifying round will be prepared according to Junior National rules 58.2 and 58.4, respectively
- Seed lists for the Interval Start and Sprint will be prepared Friday night and distributed Saturday morning via e-mail and WhatsApp.
- Corrections to BOTH LISTS are due not later than 10:00AM Sunday due to the limited time available between the conclusion of the Interval Start race and the TCM Monday afternoon.
- Once corrections have been made a start list for the Interval Start competition will be prepared and will become final at the conclusion of Sunday's TCM and then will be published to the web
- The Sprint Qualifying start list will be available late Sunday or early Monday to avoid confusion between the two lists.



Data Mgmt Schedule for Interval Start and Sprint – Fri-Sat-Sunday AM

- Friday night, March 10 – Seed lists (both Interval and Sprint) generated and approved by Jury

- 16:00PM Sunday – TCM for Interval Start
- End of TCM - Interval Start list becomes final and is published to web; hard copy provided later this evening
- End of TCM - Sprint Qualifying start list becomes final
- Later Sunday night or early Monday Morning – Sprint qualifying start list will be circulated to coaches



Weston Award Rules

61.7 The Roger Weston High School Team Award (HSTA)

61.7.2.1 Teams must have at least three individuals competing at the Junior Nationals. There is no maximum number. Competitors must be currently enrolled and attending high school at the time of the competition to be eligible. Any skier who has received a high school diploma or the equivalent certification, is ineligible, even if they are attending a school as a post-graduate skier.

61.7.2.2 Teams must be eligible to compete in their respective state high school Championships, sanctioned by the National Federation of State High School Association.

61.7.2.3 Eligibility of an individual team member is defined as meeting all the eligibility rules of the State and the High School eligibility rules that apply to High School athletes in all sports in their respective states.



JN Club Award Rules

61.8 Junior National Club Team Awards (JNCTA)

61.8.2.1 Competitors must be current members of a U.S. Ski & Snowboard Club that has established its membership before the first National Ranking List competition of the season.

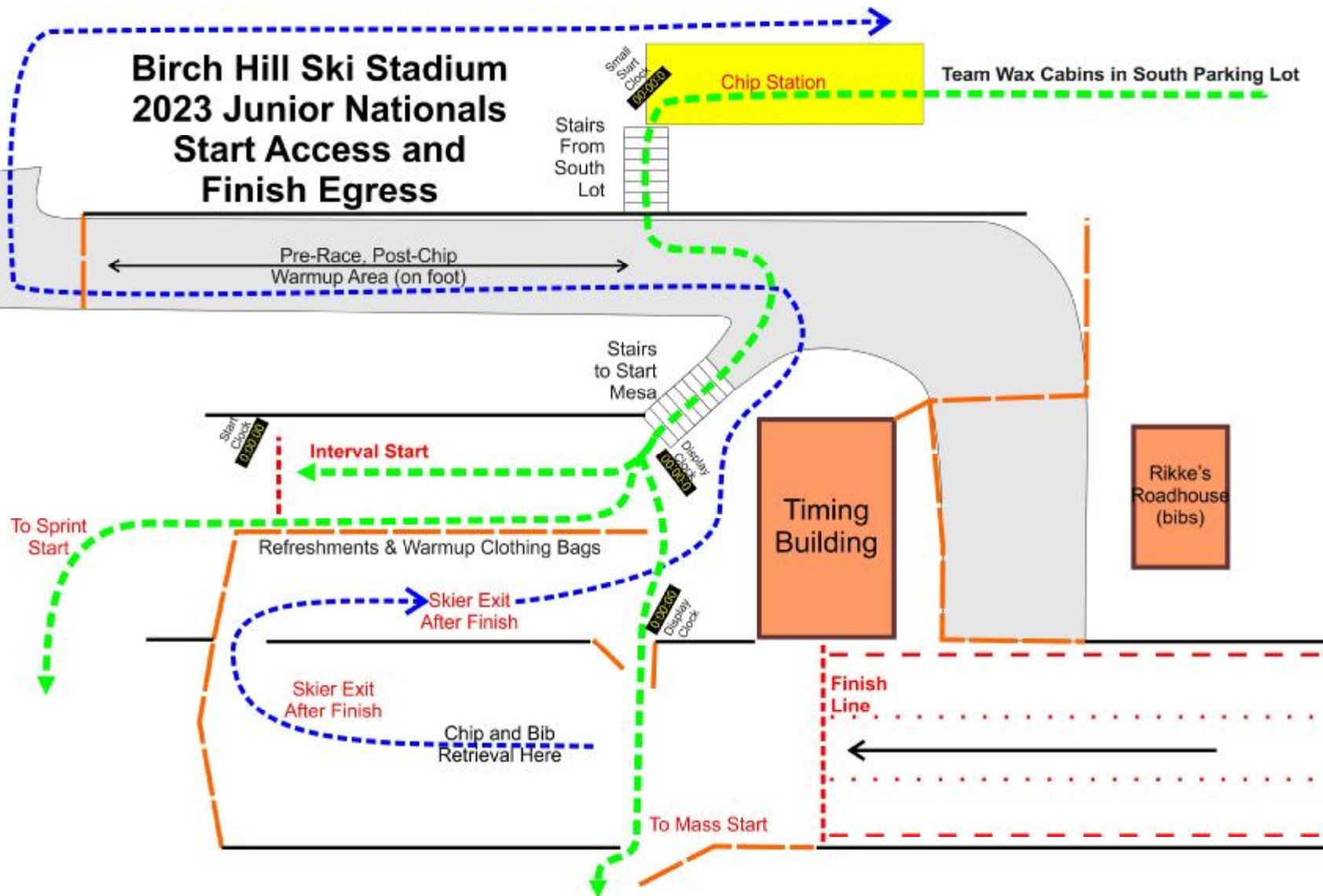

Access Routes to Start

- See routes on Course maps to follow
- All start access from waxing area MUST BE through chip attachment station
- Chip attachment station for Interval Start and Mass Start is at the bottom of stairs in NE corner of South Parking Lot
- Chip attachment station for Sprint is between the Start Mesa and the sprint start
- Once chips are attached, skiers must continue toward start area or warmup area between chip station and start



Exit Routes from Finish

- See routes on Course maps to follow
- Chips will be removed immediately after finish
- Skiers exit SW corner of finish zone to post-finish area on Start Mesa
- Skiers exit Mesa via the stairway and down the road to avoid congestion with skiers entering from chip area

Wax Testing and Warmup Loops

- These loops and the paths you should use to access these loops are shown on course maps and stadium diagrams
- Loops off the competition courses for Interval Start
 - North 40 (the upper 1Km will be groomed for testing and warming up; the remainder of the loop is available for warming up, too)
 - Blue Loop
- Loops off the competition courses for Sprint/Mass
 - West Ramp
 - Comp Loop
 - The entire North 40 is available for warming up but areas below the upper loop will not be race-groomed on race day



Testing on Course When Course is Open

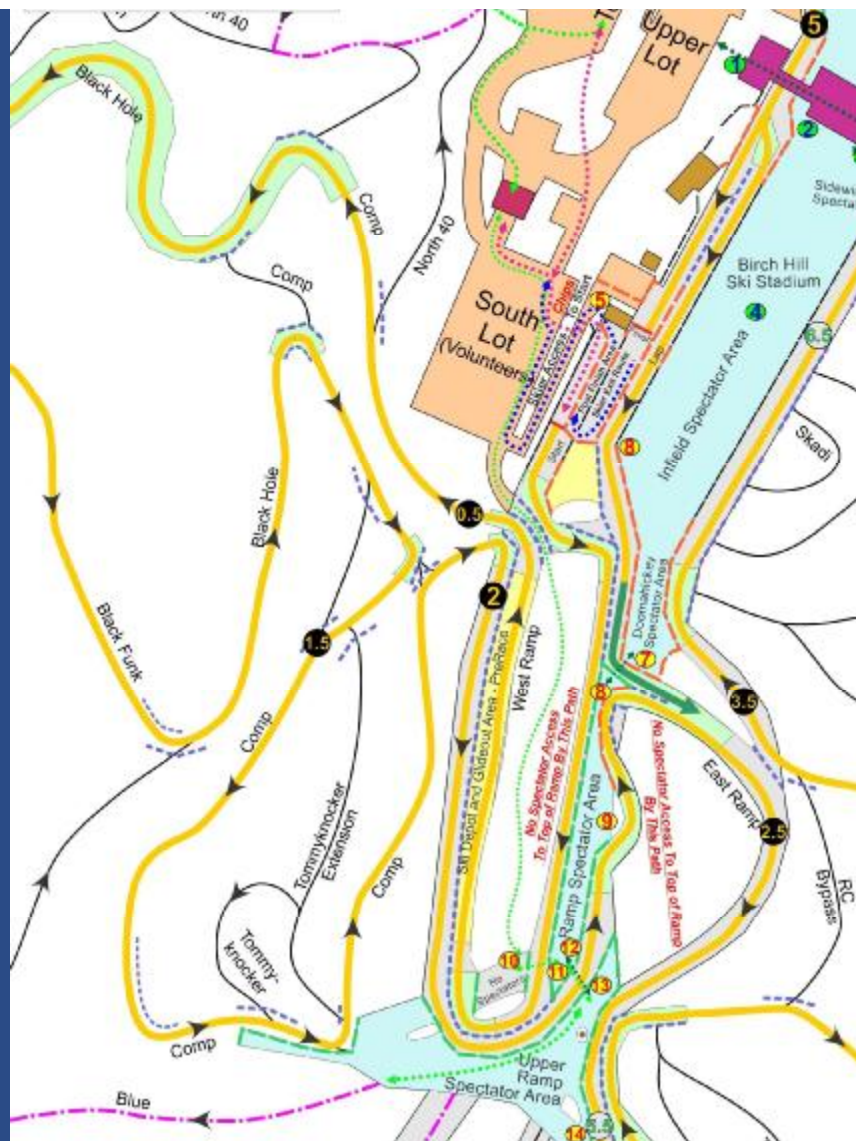
- Coaches wearing any of the bibs pictured to the right can test on course when the course is open
- Athletes in competition bibs can test and/or warmup on course when the course is open



Testing on Course During Interval Start Competition

- During the interval start competition, coaches wearing red “COACHES” bibs can test on the course between the 0.5Km mark and the 2Km mark of the course (see stadium diagram for distance markers)
- Each team will be provided two red bibs at Sunday’s TCM





Testing on Course During Sprint And Mass Start

- There will be no testing on course during the sprint and mass start competitions, except when the course is explicitly open for testing, warmup and inspection.
- All testing and warmup during the sprint and mass start competitions will take place on the designated testing and warmup tracks



Field of Play Access

- Coaches wearing any of these bibs can stand on foot – not on skis – “inside the fence” of the course during competition



Coaches in Start and Finish Areas

- One coach per division/district team allowed
- Coaches are allowed into start and finish only with Start/Finish bib
- Coaches must stay on Start Mesa or at extreme south end of finish area unless called into controlled finish area to assist an athlete.
- Coaches can also stay in the warmup area between the chip station and the Start Mesa

Weather Forecast

- Birch Hill-specific weather forecasts developed by the National Weather Service forecasters specifically for the Junior National Championships will be provided at TCMs
- From 10-day Weather Underground forecast
 - Daily High Temperatures – +9F/-13C to +12F/-11C
- Overnight Low Temperatures – -8F/-22C to -5F/-20C
- Precipitation –
 - Some chance of precipitation on Thursday, March 9
 - After Thursday, little chance of precipitation until the evening of Wednesday, March 15
